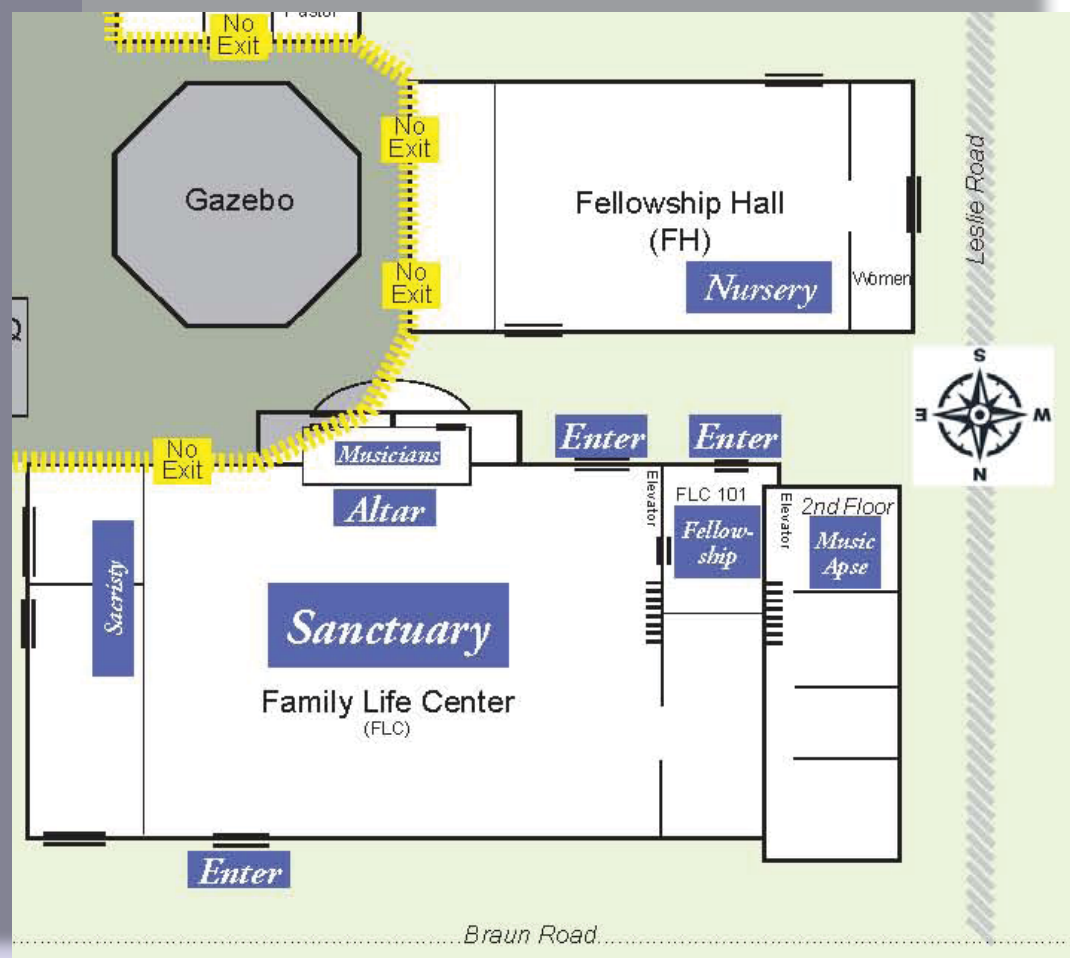

 Pastor Russell will be teaching an Adult Education class during the Epiphany Season based on the book *unChristian*. This 2007 study surveyed the attitudes of 16 through 29-year-olds towards the church and found that Christians have a problem with many young adults.

The book's publicity says, "Christians are supposed to represent Christ to the world. But according to the latest report card, something has gone terribly wrong. Using descriptions like 'hypocritical,' 'insensitive,' and 'judgmental,' young Americans share an impression of Christians that's nothing short of . . . unChristian."

You are invited to come to this honest discussion as we wrestle with this as well as talk about how we can be a community that shows the love of Christ to the world. No advance reading is required.

WHAT WAS JESUS DOING ON THAT CROSS?

Sunday Evening Class with Pastor Dave begins January 17
 The season of Lent will begin in early February this year. As we walk toward Holy Week it's an appropriate time for us to talk about why Jesus died on that cross. Pastor Schulte will be leading a Sunday evening class using Dr. David Lose's book "Making Sense of the Cross." This is a follow up to his "Making Sense of Scripture" class we did in the fall which people found so rewarding.

Dr. Phil Ruge-Jones of TLU said, "In Making Sense of the Cross you will find words to express more carefully the things that confuse you about the cross. But you will receive something even greater: You will be drawn personally into the event of the cross itself, so that Christ himself meets you and raises you into new life!"
