MEDICAL MISSION TO HONDURAS IN NOVEMBER

Collecting through October 25

Zion is hosting a mission trip to Project Talitha Cumi (PTC) girls home and school in southwest Honduras November 5-12. This trip is a medical resupply of the clinic which Zion has supported for several years. The mission team will also see 200-300 patients from the local area who have little access to other medical treatments.

The mission team is asking that the congregation, again, donate non-prescription medication needs. Stop by the display in Room 101 to pick up a tag for specific products, and return by October 25. If you prefer to give cash, those contributions will be used to help purchase as much as \$1,000 in prescription medications unavailable to the rural population. The distribution will be supervised by team member Dr. Kathy Grove.

- Hydrocortisone Cream

- Petroleum Jelly - small bottles

Maybe this is still your chance. We are extending our timeframe for applications for Zion's next Stephen Ministry training class because we are joining training efforts with other 1604 churches.

Stephen Ministers meet weekly with a person in need of a Christian listener. We are not "curegivers"...only Christ can do that. We are simply "caregivers"; allowing the Spirit to work through us in a comforting, confidential, one-to-one, Christian-based relationship. In addition, Stephen Ministers also meet twice monthly for confidential peer supervision and continuing education.

New classes will be on Thursday evenings at 7:00 beginning January 12 until May 25, 2017. Location will be: San Pedro Presbyterian Church, 14900 San Pedro Ave. (Carpooling encouraged). Lessons include topics on active listening skills, Christian assertiveness, using spiritual "tools", working through feelings, and issues such as grieving, illness, divorce, etc. No other degrees, certifications or experience is required. The primary prerequisites are a love of Christ, a call to discipleship, and a wish to serve through Zion.

CHILDREN AND CHURCH PART I – TEACHABLE MOMENTS

My child doesn't get anything out of church is a concern I hear from parents. I recently read an article written by Christina Embree concerning this topic. In it she states adults have certain expectations when they attend church. They attend because they want a sense of having been in God's presence or having learned something to help their faith grow. Many adults presume these same reasons apply to kids as well. Guess what - they don't!

Kids are still young in their faith. They don't understand what corporate worship is about or of the need to learn more. They go to church because *you as a parent go to church*. You could say they are your followers and you are their teacher. Children are learning what it means to be a Christian by watching and emulating you. So stop and think about that for a moment.

So then parents express another concern:

My children are only going to church because I make them. They go to Sunday School where they have fun but then they have to sit in church and they don't get anything out of it making it seem rather pointless.

Having had four children who went to church all the time I get it. I have often wondered why we came each week when it seems they were getting nothing out of our time in church. But I have seen and read articles concerning studies which state being in church as a child is a leading reason for "stickiness" of faith in young adults. Children must get "something" out of church even if it is not the same as what adults do, even if they seem resistant at the time.

Christina states three things children get out of church.

First of all, they get **SEEN**. Many times when churches have a Children's area it means the children are just dropped off and picked up not allowing for other members of the congregation to get to know who they are or even their names. It is important and meaningful for children that someone knows their name.

Secondly, they get to **SEE**. Children learn through emulating activities, actions and imitating them. During worship scripture is being read, Bibles are opened and the Word comes to life. Children are learning even when it seems they are not getting anything out of it. I had a parent share with me a story about their child and how one day at lunch the child just started singing something from Sunday's liturgy. Children learn by watching Mom and Dad and other adults they respect and trust to teach them how to worship.

Thirdly, they get **EXPERIENCE**. Think back on your walk of faith. Do you remember the first time you took communion? Found a Scripture verse in the Bible by yourself? Put money in the offering plate? Assisted with communion? Being an acolyte or usher? Many of us experienced this in the context of congregational worship.

Now, is this a simple or easy task? No, children are children and, at times, it is not going to be easy. There will be the occasional acting out and the eye rolls of boredom and the follow-up after the service to reinforce what was taught. However, as Christina put it "But I firmly believe these frustrations of the moment are far less painful than the alternative – a generation, who is unknown, disengaged and separated from the larger body of Christ." By being in church we give our children a place to be seen, to see and to experience their faith with others, we give them a foundation for their faith which will leave a lasting impression. If we want our children to have faith, they must be able to see that faith in us as we worship together.

SUNDAY NIGHT ADULT STUDY – BEING CHRISTIAN

Pastor Russell will be leading a book study by Rowan Williams called *Being Christian* starting October 9 at 6:00 in Church 2. Williams was the Archbishop of Canterbury from 2002 to 2012 and now teaches at Cambridge. This book offers a delightful look at the basics of the Christian faith – Baptism, Bible, Eucharist, and Prayer. Participants should order a copy of the book or purchase one from the church for \$7.50.
