COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP COORDINATOR – IS IT YOU?

Our Zion Listening Team spent time listening to folks in the community to discover a way for our church to connect better with the people who live and work around us. And we think we have found it! Our surveys inside Zion seemed to show a strong desire to connect around children's issues. Our conversations with community leaders showed us that both Mas Nichols Elementary, right across Loop 1604 on Braun Road, and O'Connor High School have some needs with which we could help. Nichols will be our first priority. Some of the key pieces include a mentoring program, a school garden, helping with PTA programs for parents who are often working two jobs to make ends meet, and helping refugee high school students with their English skills.

We are looking for a person, not to do all the work, but to lead a team of people who will work with these schools – on projects to help the kids, others to assist parents and staff. Need someone who works well with others, is detailed and organized and who can share tasks. If this sounds like you, please contact either Pastor Schulte or Pastor Peek (210-688-3090). If you know of someone who would be good for this leadership position or the team itself, please let us know as well.


