#### **DEVOTIONS**



Read: Luke 2:15-21.

This reading tells of a very Jewish foundation for the identity of this baby born in Bethlehem. On the eighth day, according to Leviticus 12:2-8, a male baby shall be circumcised. Mary and Joseph obey the will of God as it was announced by the angel and as it is required in Leviticus. They circumcise the baby and name him Jesus. Jesus is the Greek form of the Hebrew name, Joshua, meaning "the Lord saves." Biblically, a name is more than a label. It has the power to shape and transform. Numbers 6:22-27 is called the Aaronic Benediction. It ends by noting that the name of the Lord will bless the people. The name Jesus also blesses. There is power in the name of Jesus. It is the power of the presence of God in our midst to save.

*Discuss:* As the New Year begins, how does knowing the name of Jesus and his power to bring salvation to you and to all people make a difference in your life?

*Pray:* Almighty and merciful Lord, we thank you for the name of Jesus that blesses us and all the world with the hope of salvation and the power to live in peace through Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### **SERVICE**



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this week, how might you bless others to know the name of Jesus, our Savior?

#### **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**



The Holy Name of Jesus, a special day on the church calendar, is celebrated eight days after Christmas. Jesus officially received his name on the eighth day after his birth. This was not a name given to him by his parents. The name, Jesus, meaning "the Lord saves", came from God. Write the name Jesus on a sticky note and place it where you will see it every day as a reminder to pray in the name of Jesus.

**Pray:** Dear Lord, during this year, may we be reminded of your blessings in the holy name of Jesus, Amen.
