WELCOME TO ZION

When we gather for worship, we're receptive to God's word and we rejoice in God's grace through song, prayer, and Holy Communion. The history of Christian worship is rich with rituals formed by generations. These traditions, prayers, and pastoral teachings help connect our lives with Christ. In our daily lives, we show God's love by serving our community, both locally and globally.

We are a group of believers seeking to respond to Christ's call to worship and serve, even as we wrestle with the big questions of life. We want you to know that you and your questions, faith, and doubts are welcome here!

HOW WE WORSHIP

The Holy Spirit gathers people around the means of grace: the Word of God and the Sacraments. From the table of Holy Communion where Christ comes with forgiveness, life, and salvation, God sends us out to share the good news and care for those in need. Our worship follows this pattern in four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. By its very nature, Lutheran worship is participatory and the service is contained within this bulletin. Worship leaders guide us through the service and our responses are printed in **bold type.**

We welcome children in our worship services! If needed, a nursery is available down the hallway past the restrooms. The restrooms contain changing tables, as needed.

Throughout the service, members of Zion's music ministry offer their talents as an offering to God. Please receive their musical gifts as a time for prayer, contemplation, or

praise of God rather than a performance to be applauded, so that we may worship God throughout our time here together.

ASCENSION SUNDAY

Each year, forty days after Easter, we remember the Ascension of Our Lord (we move it to a Sunday to remember it as a community together). The story of the Ascension of Jesus is found three places in Scripture - we will hear two of them (from Acts and Luke) today. Acts 1 tells us that Jesus "presented himself alive to [the disciples] by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God." Eventually, after these forty days, Jesus would "ascend into heaven" and is "seated at the right hand of the Father" - this is what we proclaim together in the Apostles' Creed.

But God does not leave us on our own. Next Sunday is Pentecost, the day upon which we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit to those first followers of Jesus. The Spirit was with them; the Spirit is with us, too.


FIRST READING: ACTS 1:1-11


SECOND READING: EPHESIANS 1:15-23

ASCENSION DAY MILESTONES

CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- How do you see people using power in the world around you?
- How does Jesus' power free us to care for others and God's creation?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Luke 24:44-53.

The books of Luke and Acts are written by the same author (Luke 1:1-4 and Acts 1:1). Acts 1 begins where Luke 24 ends, with the ascension. Although the ascension of Jesus can seem like Jesus is leaving his followers behind, he is actually elevating the ministry of the church by connecting the power of God to Jesus' followers. Jesus' ascension empowers all disciples to be witnesses to Jesus. That witness will be understood through the story of Jesus passed down through the ages and interpreted through the scriptures. It is Jesus who "opened their minds to understand the scriptures" (v. 45), and it is through Jesus that the scriptures are understood. The Bible interpreted through the life of Jesus gives us the fundamental message of repentance and forgiveness. We witness to Jesus by speaking of life as a movement of repentance that is away from ourselves and toward God. This new life empowers us to forgive in the name of Jesus, the one whose death, resurrection, and ascension sends us out to care for a world in need.

Discuss: How do you give witness to Jesus in the community and the world?

Pray: Almighty God, give us courage and strength to be your witnesses of repentance and forgiveness through Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this day, how might you serve others with the power of forgiveness in the name of Jesus?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Jesus spent the last days of his appearance on earth walking and talking with the disciples. On this Ascension Day, invite others to take a walk outside with you. While you are walking, think about Jesus ascending into the clouds to heaven. Find a place to sit and take time to gaze at the sky. Look for clouds and name the shapes you can see. Ask others to explain how they would have felt if they witnessed Jesus' ascension. Then say: Alleluia! Jesus has ascended! Alleluia!
