Our worship follows this pattern in four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. By its very nature, Lutheran worship is participatory and the service is contained within this bulletin. Worship leaders guide us through the service and our responses are printed in **bold type**.

We welcome children in our worship services! If needed, a nursery is available down the hall past the restrooms. The restrooms contain changing tables, as needed.

Throughout the service, members of Zion's music ministry offer their talents as an offering to God. Please receive their musical gifts as a time for prayer, contemplation, or praise of God rather than a performance to be applauded, so that we may worship God throughout our time here together.

GREEN SEASON

The Sundays following Pentecost take us through the summer months and into the fall. These many months take us through many of the stories during the ministry of Jesus. We will also spend a significant portion of the Green Season hearing portions of Paul's letter to the Roman church. The purpose of these readings is to encourage us to grow in our faith in Christ like the growth of a green plant - little by little, each day.

How ARE you? It's a question I feel like I've answered about a gazillion times since my surgery on August 1. My answer varies widely, depending on the day and time someone asks me. How am I? Sometimes I'm feeling well, other times there's pain. Sometimes my energy is high, and then it plummets. One of the biggest pieces of this recovery time has been for me to pay attention to how I'm doing and then act accordingly. The other day, I was up at church for a meeting. I was feeling pretty well, and then I suddenly hit a wall, energy-wise. "OK," I said to the person, "I'm done," and I came home to rest.

Add "rest" to the list of things I'm grateful for.

One thing that's been really helpful is getting out to walk (in the morning, before it's 104!). After being cooped up inside, it feels great to get out and walk - even though I have to pay extra attention to my steps, sometimes move really slowly, and I can't walk the dogs just yet. Just being outside in the sunshine, surrounded by birdsong (and cicada-song) - the walks help me reconnect with creation and with our community, too.

As I ease back into my work here at Zion, I'm really having to pay extra attention there, too. Some days I really don't have much to offer, which is hard for me. Other days, I feel like I'm able to do more. In the midst of it all, one thing I'm sure of is that y'all are such a caring group of people - you've given me time and space to heal - and shown so much love to me and to Steve.

DEVOTIONS



Read: Psalm 67.

God's mercy is shown through two distinct divine actions. First, God saves us through forgiveness, rescuing us from harm, and by saving us from death. God does a second great act that we sometimes overlook. God blesses us. God blesses us with the fruit of the earth, comfort, and joy. Psalm 67 asks for God's blessings and also affirms that God has already blessed us with abundance. God intends joy for all the earth (all the nations). We are blessed to bless the nations with joy and gladness by knowing the goodness, justice, and mercy of God. In Matthew 15:21-28 that joy is experienced by the Canaanite woman, a foreigner, who is relentless in seeking help for her daughter. Jesus, who was sent "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (v. 24) resists her requests, but her persistence gains Jesus' mercy. She is acknowledged for having great faith and Jesus' mission expands to those beyond Israel. The point of both Bible texts: God's saving work and blessings are for all. Discuss: Like the Canaanite woman, when have you persisted in asking for God's mercy? Pray: Blessing God, you care for us throughout our lives. Give us your joy and gladness and

the heart to bless others with your goodness and mercy through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this week, how might you serve others who are not part of your group or nation?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The prophet Isaiah declared God's intention to make God's house (a temple in Jerusalem) a "house of prayer for all peoples" (Isaiah 56:7). Think or talk about prayer in your home. Is there a special place to pray? Is there a special time to pray? Is there a special way to pray? Do you pray alone or with others? In what ways do you feel your own home is a "house of prayer"? Pray the Lord's Prayer and then say: Let the peoples praise you, O God. Let all the peoples praise you. (Psalm 67:5)
