WELCOME TO ZION

Our worship follows this pattern in four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. By its very nature, Lutheran worship is participatory and the service is contained within this bulletin. Worship leaders guide us through the service and our responses are printed in **bold type.**

We welcome children in our worship services! If needed, a nursery is available down the hallway past the restrooms. The restrooms contain changing tables, as needed.

Throughout the service, members of Zion's music ministry offer their talents as an offering to God. Please receive their musical gifts as a time for prayer, contemplation, or praise of God rather than a performance to be applauded, so that we may worship God throughout our time here together.

REFORMATION SUNDAY

Our worship planning resource, Sundays and Seasons, has this to say: "Rooted in the past and growing into the future, the church must always be reformed in order to live out the love of Christ in an ever-changing world. We celebrate the good news of God's grace, that Jesus Christ sets us free every day to do this life-transforming work." On Reformation Sunday, we celebrate the grace of God first and foremost. Here at Zion, we also celebrate with some of our youth, who are affirming their baptismal faith in Christ today.

ON THE COVER

A photo of Zion's rose window. Martin Luther used this crest - called a Luther's Rose - to talk about his faith in Christ. The colors of each part are explained below:

- Cross black (Jesus died on the cross)
- Heart red (Our hearts are alive because of Jesus)
- Rose white (We have faith, comfort, and peace from God)
- Background blue (Reminds us of heaven)
- Outside ring yellow (Reminds us that we will be in heaven forever, praising God)



SECOND READING: ROMANS 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.


²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.



Stir up in [name] the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

DEVOTIONS



Read: Romans 3:19-28.

Paul writes to Christians in house churches in Rome. These Christians oppose one another with words and finger pointing. One group is righteous and faithful while the other is not. The church today experiences a similar polarity. Paul speaks to us now as he did then: Be silent! The law that we want to justify our own lives silences every mouth because "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (v. 23). Once Paul declares our sinfulness and judgement on one another, we are ready to hear good news. The good news is that the only thing that justifies us is God's undeserved kindness (grace). Only God is righteous and God's righteousness shown in Christ is more than a morality, it is an activity that brings the unholy world into God's goodness. Through faith, we experience being reconciled to one another and to God through Christ. We are now part of God's righteousness to heal, save the world, and trust that God's goodness can even heal our condemnation of others through faith in Christ. Discuss: How is this good news for you?

Pray: Gracious God, thank you for your goodness that acts in our lives and world to bring hope and peace to our divided relationships and world through faith in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.
