# WELCOME TO ZION

# HOW WE WORSHIP

Our worship follows this pattern in four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. By its very nature, Lutheran worship is participatory and the service is contained within this bulletin. Worship leaders guide us through the service and our responses are printed in **bold type.** 

We welcome children in our worship services! If needed, a nursery is available down the hallway past the restrooms. The restrooms contain changing tables, as needed. The break room, on the left side of the hallway, provides a quiet space for nursing. Throughout the service, members of Zion's music ministry offer their talents as an offering to God. Please receive their musical gifts as a time for prayer, contemplation, or praise of God rather than a performance to be applauded, so that we may worship God throughout our time here together.

# ADVENT

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."





# SECOND READING: HEBREWS 10:5-10

<sup>5</sup> Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; <sup>6</sup> in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. <sup>7</sup> Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." <sup>8</sup> When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), <sup>9</sup> then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. <sup>10</sup> And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

- *Do not put* paper, plastic, food or any other trash in this swing-top aluminum can collection barrel. A trash can is provided nearby.

# DEVOTIONS 🛛 🖉

Read: Luke 1:39-55.

We often think of prophecy as a statement that predicts the future. But biblical prophecy is first and foremost a statement of fact about how God is acting in the present moment. Elizabeth prophesies that there is something special about Mary's pregnancy. Even the baby inside of Elizabeth joins in that prophecy by leaping. Mary then prophesies how God is present in her humble life and how God continues to be present and active in the world. The birth of her baby is an amazing act for a poor servant, an act of the God who lifts up the lowly, feeds the hungry, and sends away the rich and powerful empty handed. The coming of the baby Jesus shines a light on the kind of God we have, one who cares for the needy and is stronger than any earthly powers. Throughout the ages, this is the God we need, the one who acts on our behalf, and the one who promises to do wondrous things through Jesus.

Discuss: How does Jesus' birth to a poor, humble servant girl show God's love?

*Pray:* Magnificent God, we praise you for lifting up Mary and for giving us a Savior through your lowly servant. Bless us with humble hearts that are filled with joy for your goodness. Amen.

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, what can you do to show God's love to someone in need?

Mary's song in Luke, also known as the Magnificat, expresses her love for God and revelation that all generations will call her blessed. She rejoices in all that God does for those in need. *Pray:* Thank you, Lord Jesus, for loving us so much. Fill our lives with love now and always. Amen.
