WELCOME TO ZION

When we gather for worship, we're receptive to God's word and we rejoice in God's grace through song, prayer, and Holy Communion. The history of Christian worship is rich with rituals formed by generations. These traditions, prayers, and pastoral teachings help connect our lives with Christ. HOW WE WORSHIP

The Holy Spirit gathers people around the means of grace: the Word of God and the Sacraments. From the table of Holy Communion where Christ comes with forgiveness, life, and salvation, God sends us out to share the good news and care for those in need. Our worship follows this pattern in four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. By its very nature, Lutheran worship is participatory and the service is contained within this bulletin. Worship leaders guide us through the service and our responses are printed in **bold type.**

We welcome children in our worship services! If needed, a nursery is available down the hallway past the restrooms. The restrooms contain changing tables, as needed. The break room, on the left side of the hallway, provides a quiet space for nursing. Throughout the service, members of Zion's music ministry offer their talents as an offering to God. Please receive their musical gifts as a time for prayer, contemplation, or praise of God rather than a performance to be applauded, so that we may worship God throughout our time here together.

THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD The feast of Epiphany ("manifestation") concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. In Isaiah and Ephesians, that glory is proclaimed for all nations and people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love to all people.





SECOND READING: EPHESIANS 3:1-12

¹This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—² for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, ³ and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴ a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵ In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶ that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. ⁷ Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; ¹⁰ so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹ This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹² in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

New Series: Being With

Starting January 26, the ten-week "Being With" course is an introduction to Christianity with a difference.

At its heart is the idea that God's greatest desire is to be with us in Jesus. Grounded in the convic-

The sessions focus on the themes of Meaning; Essence; Jesus; Church; Bible; Mission; Cross; Prayer; Suffering and Resurrection. Drawing on the practices of Godly Play, the course uses storytelling, wondering and reflection to encourage and welcome the insights that each person brings.

DEVOTIONS

Read: Isaiah 60:1-6.

Epiphany is the season that displays the glory of God in Christ. The "you" often repeated in this reading is not about us. It's about Jerusalem. Isaiah announced that God's light would shine on Jerusalem and the nations would come to the light. How is it that nations that had destroyed Jerusalem and the whole of Israel would now come and bow down to this city? What a bold claim Isaiah made! We believe that the light that shines for all the world centers on Jesus. He is a person born to a poor and otherwise unknown couple and someone who would die at the hands of powerful political and religious leaders. This also seems to be a bold claim. For the church, Jesus' life, death, and resurrection is the ultimate power in the world. This Jesus who comes to teach, heal, and save the world takes on all earthly powers and conquers. That is the glory of God that shines on Jesus and now on us as those who look to Jesus to change the world and give it hope.

Discuss: What powers do you see that need to be reminded that God's glory shines on Jesus? *Pray:* God of the nations, give us the confidence to confess Jesus as the light that shines for all the world to know as Savior and Lord. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Epiphany Bible Readings and theme for this day, how can you help someone find hope when going through tough times?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The wise men were guided by a star in their search for Jesus, the newborn king. As Christians, we are *"stars"* that God uses to point other people to Jesus. Think or talk about how your life can be a light that shines for Jesus. Cut out star shapes. Write words to describe different ways you can *"shine"* for Jesus in your relationships with others on the stars. Place them in a visible space in your home as a reminder of Jesus' light in your life.

Pray: Dear God, just as you guided the wise men with a star and led others to help people see the *"boundless riches of Christ"*, may we be your messengers of the good news of Christ for the world. Amen. (Ephesians 3:8-9)
